ART & DESIGN BTEC NATIONALS LEVEL 3

Is this the right course for me?

This course is for you if your ambition is to follow a career in art and design after your secondary education. You will be introduced to a broad range of art and design subjects before deciding which art and design specialism you would like to follow at higher education level. The BTEC Nationals allows you to achieve a full level 3 qualification in Art & Design. The course is run over 2 years and allows you to achieve up to a 90 credit Diploma in the first year and up to an Extended National Diploma in the second year. You could then apply for a place at university, or complete the BTEC Foundation Diploma (Level 4) before going to university.

What will I need to join the course?

You will need to demonstrate at interview your enthusiasm for art and design and bring along with you a portfolio of work which includes drawing, 2-D and 3-D studies, photography, sketch books and work which shows your own personal interests.

The Nationals in Art & Design is a vocational qualification, can be the equivalent of up to 3 A levels. You need to be at least 16 years of age on entry and have at least 3 GCSE passes at grade C or above, preferably including English Language.

If you are an independent mature student without the required formal qualifications you will need to demonstrate that you have a basic level of education to enable you to complete the course. You must also be prepared to bring to interview recent work which demonstrates your enthusiasm for the subject.

What will I be doing?

You will be following a programme which will offer a wide range of experience of Art and Design practice, including Fine Art, Graphic Design, Photography, Three Dimensional Design, Fashion and Textile Design.

Your work will be project based; in the first term you will be introduced to studio based and workshop activity including all the above areas. During the second and third term you will undertake projects that will allow you to be able to specialise in one or two areas of art and design. The second year allows for increasing specialism in an art or design based area such as Graphic design, Fashion and Textiles, Fine art, Three-dimensional design, Animation, Illustration, Photography and many other specialist areas.

The full qualification requires you to study 18 units over the 2 years.

How long will the course last and what patterns of attendance are available?

One year attendance will be required 4 days a week.

How will my progress on the course be assessed?

By a range of methods which may include projects, assignments, case studies and course work. There will also be two specialist units which are externally examined. You will be supported by individual tutorials where your progress can be discussed and help given.

What does it cost?

Tuition fees will be discussed at interview.

BTEC fee (over 19s only) will be discussed at interview.
