



CACHE LEVEL 3 DIPLOMA IN CHILDRENS CARE AND EDUCATION

Is this the right course for me?

Do you want to work with children?

Would you like the opportunity to gain experience in a range of work placements?

Do you want to meet other people and get yourself a nationally recognised qualification at Level 3?

If you can answer yes to all the above then this is the course for you.

What do I need to join the course?

A level 2 CCLD qualification at an overall grade of 'C', or 4 GCSE's at grade C or above, and a successful interview.

What will I be doing?

You will study units over two years and these are-

- An introduction to working with children
- Development
- Supporting children
- Keeping children safe
- The principles underpinning the role of the practitioner working with children
- Promoting a healthy environment
- Play and learning
- Caring for children
- Professional skills
- Plus 3 optional units

During your practical training you will have to spend time at 3 different childcare placements.

How will my progress on the course be assessed?

Units are assessed either through assignments, portfolio work, an externally marked case study with written questions and an externally marked research project.

What will I achieve?

The Level 3 Diploma in CCE prepares you to work with children and their families in a variety of settings and environments within the sector of Children's Services

And the future?

It also gives you the opportunity to apply for further training in:
-higher education

What does it cost?

Tuition Fees - To be discussed at interview

You will be required to buy a relevant childcare pack, college polo shirt placement and pay for an enhanced Criminal Records Bureau Check
